Health & Human Services Levy on ballot receives support from mayors

The association representing city leaders throughout Cuyahoga County has endorsed the county's Health and Human Services Levy, which will appear on March ballots as Issue 33. The vote to support the levy was unanimous.

Richard Bain, secretary of the Cuyahoga County Mayors & City Managers Association said: "The Health and Human Services levy will provide the critical funds necessary to support vital services for our county's

kids, seniors, healthcare and family services. Supporting the levy will address the gap in funding caused by growing needs and expenses. This is an essential levy we can - and the county mayors have - all agreed upon."

Broadview Hts. Mayor Sam Alai states that "Issue 33 is not only beneficial to Broadview Heights, it is vital for the entire County."

According to Seven Hills Mayor Anthony Biasiotta, "Issue 33 will help the county to continue to provide qual-

ity health and human services. These types of services are best handled at a regional level and tend to be the bedrock good communities are built on."

Parma Mayor Tim DeGeeter encourages residents to "please vote for Issue 33" on the March 17th ballot. "There's a social obligation to help those in need but there's also compelling economic reasons to do so." If we don't invest now in the county's wide-ranging services paid for by this levy,
