UH Parma limits visitors, surgeries, outpatient services during COVID-19

University Hospitals Parma Medical Center has mobilized, as part of a coordinated effort across the 18-hospital University Hospitals system, to care for patients presenting with symptoms of the novel coronavirus COVID-19. To ensure a safe environment, UH Parma has implemented many changes for patients and visitors.

All non-essential surgeries, as determined between patients and their surgeons, have been postponed, un-

der the recommendations of Governor DeWine and the Ohio Department of Health. Anyone who must undergo surgery is allowed to have one visitor, who will be screened for a temperature below 99.6 F and to ensure they do not have flu-like symptoms. The Emergency Department also is allowing only one appropriately screened visitor per patient, as it focuses on caring for an increase in patients presenting with COVID-19 symptoms.

“UH Parma Medical Center has a longstanding tradition of providing health care for the community,” says James Hill, MD, Associate Chief Medical Officer of UH Parma Medical Center. “Our staff is well-trained and equipped to handle these patients.”

No visitors are allowed on general inpatient medical floors or at the UH Seidman Cancer Center for the duration of this pandemic. Volunteers have (Continued on Page 6)
